Geography – What's the location?

Prior knowledge

In their journey through KS1, children have already located Scarborough within North Yorkshire, England and the UK and identified the North Sea as part of their locality. They have broadened their locational knowledge to include the four countries of the UK and have located the continents of Europe and Africa.

Core knowledge

- The UK is made up of England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland (recap).
- The world is made up of seven continents: Europe, Asia, Antarctica, Oceania, North America, South America, and Africa.
- There are five oceans: Indian, Atlantic, Arctic, Pacific, and Antarctic.
- The 4 seas around the UK are: English Channel, North Sea, Irish Sea, and Atlantic Ocean.

Key skills

- Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.
- Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas.
- Use maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries.
- Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify continents and oceans.
