### Prior knowledge

- A significant person has done something which is remembered today.

- Captain Scott was an explorer who led two expeditions to the Antarctic. He discovered a new part of the South Pole.
- Matthew Henson was a significant polar explorer. He was the first person to ever stand on top of the world.
