### Art and design – Printing- Andy Warhol/pop-art.

#### Prior Knowledge

In year 5, children created William Morris inspired wallpaper mood boards and repeated prints

#### Core knowledge

- Andy Warhol was the catalyst for the pop-art movement
- Pop-art is representative of popular Western culture
- Andy Warhol created many screen prints
- Prints can be created by cutting back (as children have before). This is called relief. They can also be built up from a base plate and this can be made of card, metal, Styrofoam etc

#### Key skills

- Talk about the work of Andy Warhol and how he created his work
- Use a sketch book to explore and collect ideas
- Use tools with ever increasing control and precision
- Create a repeating pattern for a wrapping paper design
